

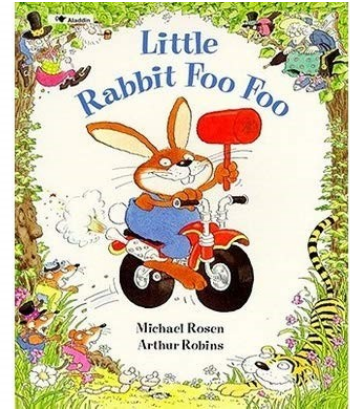
Rabbit Activity Sheet

Since it is nearly Easter, I thought rabbits would make the perfect theme. In this activity sheet you can make rabbit headband, listen to a story and learn some bunny facts.

Unlike the Easter Bunny, who is very kind giving out chocolate eggs at Easter, Little Rabbit Foo Foo is a meanie to lots of woodland folk. Bunny Ear Headband



What you need

A band of paper to fit around your child's head. I have used plain wallpaper but you could use plain A4 paper or a cereal box.

2X bunny ears (there are lots of templates online to use)

Stapler or tape

Glue or double sided tape

Natural materials such as grass, flowers, leaves and sticks

How to make it

Cut out your head band. You can either cut it out as one piece with ears attached or cut the band and ears separately.

Gather some natural materials to decorate your headband.

Apply glue or double-sided tape to the headband and stick on natural materials.

Try the headband on your child's head and fasten in place.
